



Goffstown Public Library Addition & Renovation

This was a two-phase project. The first phase involved the interior renovation of the existing facility, with emphasis on new millwork for book storage, new checkout areas at two locations and a customized built-in desk area.

The library was in need of additional usable space, which also necessitated the conversion of attic space from an excess storage area into a complete fit-up, including a conference area and new space for quiet reading.

During the second phase, a three story addition was constructed. The new space was needed to accommodate a three-stop elevator and exit stairs for handicap accessibility.

The exterior addition was very unique in that it had to match the wood trim and brickwork of a 100-year old building that was listed with the National Park Service as a historical building.

The facility was open every day during the entire construction period, remaining totally operational and in use by the general public.
